The Buffalo Central Terminal has always been a gateway to possibility. From 1925 to 1929, people gathered to plan and build what was seen as Buffalo's foundation for a new future. From 1929 to 1979, the Central Terminal helped businesses expand and thrive, gave people of all backgrounds a new chance at life, and added to the city's cultural diversity.

In 1996, dedicated preservationists founded the Central Terminal Restoration Corp. In 1997, the CTRC acquired the Central Terminal and began its mission to redevelop Buffalo's majestic historic landmark—one of the region's true architectural treasures—as an enduring cultural and economic hub for the community.

Today, we continue to honor the Central Terminal's legacy as we reestablish the campus as a center of activity—a beacon that attracts people and investment; celebrates and fosters diverse community voices; connects and shapes broad and equitable revitalization efforts; and builds a new foundation for a strong, shared future for the city and region.

And we're just getting started.

Our Champions

We greatly appreciate significant funding from the **Regional Revitalization Partnership (RRP)**, a 10-year, \$300 million comprehensive economic development strategy and public-private partnership. Of that funding, an initial investment of \$61 million was allocated to advance our vision to establish the Central Terminal as a regional destination for year-round, indoor and outside activities.

Developed in collaboration with New York State Gov. Kathy Hochul and Empire State Development (ESD), the RRP was designed to build community wealth through multiple paths for Buffalo's East Side, Niagara Falls, and Rochester. The RRP is supported by ESL Federal Credit Union; Evans Bank; the Max and Marian Farash Charitable Foundation; Five Star Bank; the KeyBank/First Niagara Foundation; the William & Sheila Konar Foundation; M&T Bank; the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation; and partners in the cities of Buffalo, Niagara Falls, and Rochester. The Center for Regional Strategies leads the RRP's implementation.

Our Neighbors

In 2024, the Central Terminal continued to offer a fun calendar of free, community-focused programming. These events fostered a sense of pride and belonging, while also helping shift perceptions of the Broadway-Fillmore neighborhood. By centering community voices and celebrating local culture, the Buffalo Central Terminal reinforced its role as a welcoming space and a symbol of momentum on Buffalo's East Side.

Our free, family-friendly programming

This past year, the Terminal came alive with a full calendar of events, bringing neighbors together and welcoming new visitors to the campus. Four lively Summer Concerts, high-energy Health is Wealth fitness bootcamps, and fun Family Movie Nights brought our Lawn to life. Signature events like the Central Terminal Car Show, a Shakespearean performance, and our annual Back-to-School Giveaway created moments of joy and connection. Seasonal celebrations—including Eid Fest, Fall Fest, and the beloved Trunk-or-Treat—offered something for everyone, reinforcing that Buffalo Central Terminal is a welcoming place for all.

Our Future is Bright

We are inspired by the innovative ways visionaries and funders reinvent abandoned train stations. Gare d'Orsay in Paris. Union Terminal in Cincinnati. Union Station in Kansas City. Union Pacific Depot in Salt Lake City. Michigan Central Station in Detroit.

READYING FOR CONSTRUCTION

In 2023 and 2024, **Quinn Evans**, our Architecture and Engineering Team lead, thoroughly investigated the current condition of the Buffalo Central Terminal campus to fully understand the buildings. With their expertise, we gained the most comprehensive understanding ever of the historic buildings, identified areas in need of stabilization, and developed a rehabilitation strategy toward reuse.

READYING FOR REUSE

Our Developer Team—**CB Emmanuel Realty, Alexander Company, and Rise Community Capital**— is advancing development focused on building local jobs, spaces for local businesses and entrepreneurs, and housing to retain local residents and attract new ones. Planned uses include entertainment and events; a regional and international food hall that complements the Broadway Market; culinary education space; mixed-income rental housing; attainable home ownership; light industrial and maker space; coworking and collaborative spaces; quality childcare and childhood education services; neighborhood retail spaces; and mobility options and transportation linkages.



Our Next Steps

In 2024, using the information gathered by Quinn Evans, we began Phase 2 Construction toward the reactivation and reuse of the Main Terminal Building. **Buffalo Construction Consultants**, our chosen Construction Manager, continued to coordinate the construction bidding process and oversee all contractors engaged in the stabilization of the Buffalo Central Terminal.

The goal of the \$33 million Phase 2 Construction is to address high-priority safety and structural issues in the Main Terminal Building; seal the iconic Tower and the Passenger Concourse to stop water intrusion and related deterioration; and reopen the Passenger Concourse for public access.

The CTRC and the City of Buffalo are working together on this reuse project. The CTRC owns the 12.5 acres at 495 Paderewski Drive that includes the Main Terminal Building and the Mail & Baggage Building. The City of Buffalo owns 59 Memorial Drive, the 16-acre property that includes the Post Office Building and the remains of the Railway Express Building.

PHASE 2 UPDATES

Erected scaffolding for the exterior "buck hoist" elevator.

Installed the "buck hoist" elevator for easier access to the iconic Tower's upper floors.

Replaced nearly 400 window coverings!

Actively recruited MWBE construction contractors and a local workforce.

Performed materials testing and structural analysis of the masonry, concrete, and steel.

Conducted "sounding" of Guastavino tiles to test stability.



The new window coverings are a mix of corrugated plastic (with a glass-like sheen), painted wood, and louvered fittings. These new covers protect the building from rain, wind, and snow, while keeping the interior free from moisture and mold. The louvered fittings provide proper air flow and ventilation to avoid damage from high winds, while making it easier for construction crews to work inside.



With temporary window coverings in place, masonry repairs can begin.

The Buffalo Central Terminal's renewal ensures that this iconic structure is more than a backdrop—it's an active part of the community and a place to build new memories.

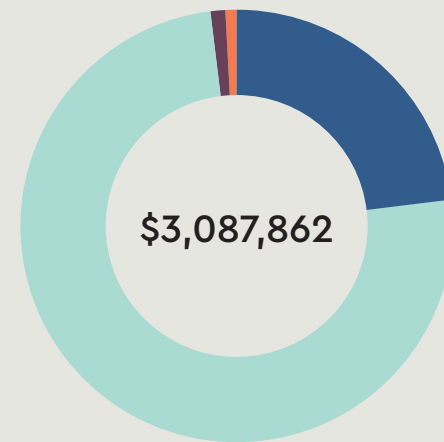

We have made tremendous progress to strengthen the financial health of our organization to ensure a strong future for the Buffalo Central Terminal.

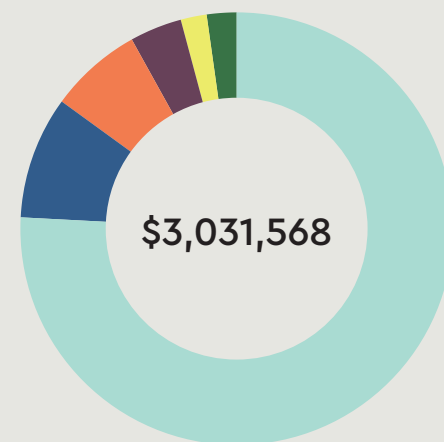
MORE AND MORE OF OUR EXPENSES ARE DEDICATED TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS.

Capital improvements have remained a major focus of our spending, increasing from 55% of total expenses in 2022 to 73% in 2023 and 76% in 2024. This upward trend reflects our continued investment in stabilizing and reactivating the Buffalo Central Terminal.
